THE DQU EXTENSION PROGRAM  
FOR EXTENDED LEARNING  
AND SPECIAL PROJECTS

THE DQU EXTENSION PROGRAM shall encompass all of the extension, outreach, and extended learning programs offered from time to time by DQ University which are not part of the regular Associate in Arts degree program.

Programs included herein shall include such offerings as those resulting in GED certificates and all other special certificates (for example, early childhood education, tribal management, casino management, et cetera) and all contract programs offering specialized coursework.

The students enrolled in DQU Extension shall not be counted as part of the count of A.A. degree students, but may be counted as part of totals of people served generally by the university in all programs.

[The existence of the DQU Extension will make possible the continued service of non-federally-recognized Indigenous peoples and non-Native Americans generally without compromising the status of DQU as a Tribally-Controlled Community College by undercutting the Federally-recognized student count in the A.A. degree program]

{This proposal, by Prof. Jack D. Forbes, in summer 2004, was designed to broaden the base of DQU and to increase the numbers served. It was not implemented.}
